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CALL FOR PAPERS

The School of Music and the Graduate Studies Program announce the V International Symposium of Musicology of the Federal University of Rio de Janeiro, to be held from August 11 to 15, 2014, and welcome the submission of papers.

The V SIM_UFRJ "Music Periodicals: History, Criticism, and Editorial Policies" celebrates the 80th anniversary of the *Revista Brasileira de Música*, the first academic journal in the area of music in Brazil, and calls for studies on specialized music journals as well as music columns within general magazines and newspapers dealing with their historical and critical dimensions, and their role in the dissemination of knowledge in the area of music in several European countries as well as in the Americas, with particular emphasis on Latin America, and, especially, in Brazil. This Symposium provides an opportunity for Brazilian and foreign scholars to engage in the discussion of the following topics:

- history of music periodicals
- music criticism
- reception history
- cultural dialogues, circulation, transfer and appropriation of ideas, repertories, aesthetics, styles, musical practices and ideologies
- nationalism, migration and identity
- heritage and collections
- music, society and politics
- interdisciplinary studies: visual arts, theatre, literature, philosophy, history, sociology and cultural anthropology
- discursive strategies in the relationship between art and science
- knowledge and power
- current scientific and editorial policies

The joint meeting of the V UFRJ International Symposium of Musicology "Musical Periodicals: History, Criticism and Editorial Policies" and of the IV National Forum of Editors of Music Periodicals seeks to debate on current scientific and editorial policies.

The Symposium will gather prominent specialists from Latin America, Europe, and the United States, thus furthering the dialogue among communities of scholars from various countries. The selected papers will be published in the Proceedings, in printed and electronic formats, and will be available at no cost

on the site of the School of Music of the UFRJ. It will be distributed to libraries, research and cultural institutions in Brazil and abroad, and graduate study programs.

SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

Proposals must be sent to the e-mail sim@musica.ufrj.br no later than May 18, 2014, and shall be addressed to the Program Committee Chair according to the instructions below.

- 1. Proposals must be original works and address issues related to the conference theme SIM_UFRJ2014.
- 2. Each paper will have 20 minutes for oral presentation. The full text to be published should include between 3,000 and 6,000 words and not exceed 15 pages, including illustrations and bibliographic references.
- 3. Proposals may be written in Portuguese, Spanish, English, French, Italian or German. It is highly recommended, however, that oral presentations be in Portuguese, Spanish or English. Proposals in Portuguese, Spanish, French, Italian or German must include the following information in English: title of the paper, abstract, keywords, and author(s)'s short curriculum(a).
- 4. Academic writing must follow ABNT guidelines, and quotations must be indicated in the text by the author-date system.
- 5. Proposals must be sent by e-mail as an attachment in Microsoft Word *.doc, *.docx or Rich Text Format [*.rtf]. Please, identify the electronic file name as <LastNameAuthor_ submission>.
- 6. At the top of the cover page, the author must fill out the following **header**:

I submit the paper of my authorship entitled ". . ." for consideration by the Program Committee of the V UFRJ International Symposium of Musicology. In case of approval, I hereby authorize SIM_UFRJ2014 editor to publish it in print and / or electronic version (online) at the institution's site as well as commit myself to send the full, revised version of the paper until June 30, 2014 for publication.

Abstract

Abstract in English up to 500 words. Times New Roman, type size 10; 1.0 line spacing; justified alignment; 3 cm for all margins.

Keywords

all in small letters – up to five keywords – separated by dash Times New Roman - type size 10 - 1.0 line spacing –justified alignment – 3 cm for all margins.

A quotation longer than 3 lines should be blocked in single-spaced and indented text, Times New Roman, type size 10; 1.0 line spacing; justified alignment. Quotation quotation

Images such as illustrations, musical examples, tables, figures, charts etc. should be placed in the text as Figure and identified at the bottom with proper numbering and legend that synthetically explains the information gathered there. Once the paper has been aproved for publication, the images should be sent separately in individual files in .jpeg ou .tif (minimum resolution of 300 dpi) and named according to their placement in the text. For example: fig_1.jpg; fig_2.jpg; fig_3.jpg; table_1.tif; table_2.tif etc.

The author is responsible for obtaining copyright permission for reproduction of all images, such as illustrations, musical texts, tables, figures, and music examples.

At the end of the text, include references (bibliographical, sites, historical documentation, audio-visual records etc.). Historical documentation and ethnographic records may be listed separatedly at the discretion of the author.

Short curriculum(a) of the author(s)

AUTHOR'S NAME followed by a short biografical note informing the author(s)'s professional activities and academic training, up to 150 words in the following order: institutional affiliation, title (from highest to lowest), other relevant information and main publications (journal or publisher, year). Times New Roman, type size 10; 1.0 line spacing; 3 cm for all margins; justified alignment. All information in the same paragraph, each item separated by dot.
